Re: Delegation of Functions
under the Public Service Regulations (1961)

Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Departments are hereby notified that the Governor General of Jamaica, acting on the advice of the Public Service Commission, has agreed to the delegation under the Public Service Regulations (1961) of appointment to all offices in the Public Service which are classified below the level of Senior Executive Group 1 (SEG 1) or equivalent to the Chief Personnel Officer with effect from the 1st September, 2002.

It should be noted that this delegation is not applicable for those offices in relation to Permanent Secretaries which already have delegated authority.

THE CONSTITUTION OF JAMAICA

THE DELEGATION OF FUNCTIONS (PUBLIC SERVICE) ORDER, 2002

By His Excellency the Most Honourable SIR HOWARD

In exercise of the power conferred on the Governor-General by section 127 (1) of the Constitution of Jamaica, and of every other power hereunto enabling, the following Order is hereby made on the advice of the Public Service Commission:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Delegation of Functions (Public Service) Order, 2002.

2.—(1) Subject to sub-paragraph (2) and the provisions of the Public Service Regulations, 1961, the power of the Governor-General specified in the Schedule to this Order shall, with effect from the 1st September, 2002, be exercisable by the Chief Personnel Officer in relation to the offices specified in that schedule.

(2) Sub-paragraph (1) shall not apply to any office specified in the Delegation of Functions (Public Service) (Specified Ministries and Departments) Order, 2000.

3. The power referred to in paragraph 2 shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions of the Public Service Regulations, 1961.
